### Third country subsidies – levelling the playing field

11 July 2022

On 30 June 2022, the European Parliament and EU Member States reached a political agreement on the Foreign Subsidies Regulation. The European Commission will be able to initiate investigations 6 months and 20 days after the FSR will have entered into force, the notification obligations for the companies will become effective three months later.

### European Commission publishes long-awaited updated regulation and guidelines on vertical agreements

The European Commission recently published its proposed revised Vertical Block Exemption Regulation and Draft Vertical Guidelines. The new Regulation and guidelines are being brought in to replace the current Regulation which came into force in 2010 and is due to expire on 31 May 2022.
